- 2. Identifies areas of concern
- 3. Identifies causes/sources of the problem
- 4. Identifies standards in place and areas for improvement
- 5. Identifies and recommends best management practices (BMPs) that can be implemented

 - **Sample Activities:** Identify opportunities to expand the City's Grow Zones along Shoal Creek, recommend opportunities for changes to stewardship of creekside private land
