For Next Meeting: Finish brainstorming and then define actions and who is going to do it

Implementation Working Group Objectives:

- Identify possible leadership structures for implementation
 - Determine who has oversight over the Watershed Action Plan once EPA has accepted it so ensure the plan is implemented.
 - Is this a long term structure or short term?
 - Brainstorm ideas:
 - Nicole usually morphs into less formal group, but decision making structure still exists
 - SCC as continued facilitator
 - Interest in some sort of formal framework
 - Our role: figure out who is going to step up to make sure it gets implemented
 - Importance of continuing to recruit people and maintain interest, maintaining records
 - Think about it as types of solutions: Capital improvements, programmatic solutions, regulatory. Lots of group do work, but who is in charge of oversight
 - Oversight and framework for implementation
 - Question Resolution, come from staff rather than city council members
 - Long-term structure yes!
 - Oversight structure necessary
 - Consider formal agreement to define roles MOU with City and SCC for implementation?
 - Actions:
 - Meeting to Chris to explore ideas of resolution coming from City staff rather than council, formal agreement - with Suzanne and Nina

Identify diverse funding mechanisms for implementation

- Possible potential for the authority over the Watershed Action Plan to have a sub-committee responsible for funding/grant writing etc.
- Brainstorm:
 - Drainage Utility Fee
 - One Water as an opportunity for funding
 - Grants City can get but nonprofits
 - Clean Waters State revolving funds, low interest loan
 - Nicole more funding for rural
- Actions:

- Ask Jessica Wilson for her ideas on this, she has lots
- Ask Mateo about ideas for funding of Waller 3
- Share One Water conference info with whole group
- Fill in the spreadsheet of funding sources
- Anna share ideas from Cypress, Stream Team

• Identify avenues for implementation of management measures that work within the City's existing programs, policies and priorities

- Ideas:
 - Go department by department and then review city strategic plan then figure out how it aligns
 - Good start on WCR
 - Depts: Public Works, Watershed, Transportation, PARD, Zoning
 - Policies: Watershed Protection Watershed Plan
 - MS 4 specific things listed
- Actions:
 - Review existing programs, policies and priorities and creating a short list document
- Ensure final Plan is easy to read, approachable and accessible to the public, in partnership with E&O working group
- Ensure key stakeholders and decision makers involved throughout the process
