- Seton planning several underground parking garages that we are concerned could impact Seiders Springs
- Part of Seton PUD amendment
- Jessica: not uncommon to run into groundwater during development. how they deal with routing groundwater is important.

## Briefing on COA's Trash in Creeks report (Andrew Clamann)

- Lots of trash from multiple sources
- No pattens re: trash and land use type
- Single use plastics most common trash type
- 76% of trash found in 10% of area
- WPD Trash in Creeks Field Observations map GIS resource
- Linda: how do we pursue implementation of some of these solutions?
- Jessica: need to evaluate resources that are available within budget cycle

# Briefing on Downtown Operations by John Beachy - FY22 Year in Review

- DTO born out of creation of Waller Creek Tunnel. New O&M staff added to help maintain tunnel, pumps, etc
- WCT diverted 13 rain events in 2022

- 940 tons material diverted
- 60 tons of trash removed from downtown waterways
- Work closely with Trail Conservancy, KAB
- Forklift Danceworks production with Watershed staff
